Mike (Bilyk), headliner at the party-controlled club, foresees his eclipse on the day that tousle-haired loner Viktor (Yoo) appears out of nowhere and galvanizes the scene with a rock anthem. 
# HELF LIFE:

For decades, Chicago was renowned as "Candy Capital of the World," home to the giants Brach, Mars, Ferrara, and Wrigley, as well as scores of mid-sized and small family-owned companies. Filmmaker Lahey's Italian immigrant grandfather Enzo Lanzi began making candy in 1920. In 1973, at the age of 78, he created an international hit—Lanzi's Cashew Nut Crunch. #### IT HAPPENED ONE **NIGHT**

1934, Frank Capra, USA, 105 min. With Clark Gable, Claudette Colbert

Often identified as the film where the screwball genre begins, IT HAPPENED ONE NIGHT changed the face of American screen comedy. Colbert and Gable make an iconic pairing as Ellie, an heiress caught up in a scandalous marriage, and Peter, an out-of-work newspaperman who sees Ellie's plight as just the story to revive his career—both travelling via Greyhound bus to New York City. Famously the first film to win all five major Oscars (Picture, Director, Actor, Actress, and Screenplay). DCP digital. (CW)

#### MY MAN GODFREY

1936, Greaory La Caya, USA, 96 min. With William Powell, Carole Lombard

Discovered by a pair of uppercrust sisters on a scavenger hunt for a "forgotten man," the oddly erudite vagrant Godfrey Smith (Powell) finds himself working as a butler for perhaps the nuttiest family in high society, with their ditzy daughter (Lombard) nursing a crush on him. A critical and commercial hit from undervalued director La Cava, MY MAN GODFREY turned the increasingly stale society comedy on its head, replacing genteel innuendo with rampant, gleeful chaos. 35mm. #### THE AWFUL TRUTH

1937, Leo McCarey, USA, 91 min. With Cary Grant, Irene Dunne

Perhaps the definitive remarriage romance of the screwball era, THE AWFUL TRUTH stars Grant and Dunne as estranged husband and wife Jerry and Lucy Warriner, who both pursue other romantic partners while waiting a requisite 90 days for their divorce to be finalized. This master class in pressure-cooker romance ramps up the comic misunderstandings and slapstick set-pieces as the Warriners find themselves falling deeper in love with every pratfall and public humiliation. #### **EASY LIVING**

1937, Mitchell Leisen, USA, 89 min. With Jean Arthur, Edward Arnold, Ray Milland

After a fur coat, tossed out the window by irate plutocrat J.B. Ball (Arnold), lands in the lap of Mary Smith (Arthur), she meets Ball's ne'er-do-well son (Milland) in an automat, falls in love, instigates perhaps the greatest foodfight ever put on screen, and somewhere along the line sets the stock market reeling. Scripted by screwball stalwart Preston Sturges, EASY LIVING is one of Hollywood's great comedies of class mobility. 35mm. (CW)

#### THE LADY EVE

1941, Preston Sturges, USA, 94 min. With Barbara Stanwyck, Henry Fonda

Sturges's third directorial effort was his first major triumph in the romantic comedy form—a riotous shell game of false identities, shady motives, and good-natured chicanery. Stanwyck stars as sultry confidence woman Jean, who sets out to scam mild-mannered beer heir Charles (Fonda), only to fall in love and abandon her larcenous plans. When Charles dumps her after learning of her criminal past, Jean decides to get her revenge, posing as "Eve," a British noblewoman. 35mm. (CW)

#### THE PALM BEACH STORY

1942, Preston Sturges, USA, 88 min. With Joel McCrea, Claudette Colbert, Rudy Vallée

Saturday, July 20, 5:15 pm Tuesday, July 23, 6:00 pm

While poverty-stricken inventor Tom Jeffers (McCrea) tries to sell investors on a radical new idea in aviation, his loving wife Gerry (Colbert) formulates her own plan to leave her husband for somebody richer who will agree to invest in Tom. Featuring a psychotically rowdy group of old men known as the "Ale and Quail Hunting Club," THE PALM BEACH STORY finds Sturges pushing his comedy to the outer reaches of absurdity, grounded by Tom and Gerry's genuinely affecting relationship. 35mm. An ineffectual paleontologist (Grant) with a dour, sexless fiancée is cajoled by an outgoing adventuress (Hepburn) into escorting her pet leopard through New England on the eve of his wedding. BRINGING UP BABY ramped up the speed and absurdity of the romantic comedy template to a level never before seen, folding in subplots galore concerning a missing dinosaur bone, crossdressing, and escaped circus animals. 35mm. #### MAN'S FAVORITE SPORT?

1964, Howard Hawks, USA, 121 min. With Rock Hudson, Paula Prentiss

This stealth Technicolor remake of BRINGING UP BABY stars Hudson and Prentiss as Roger, author of a celebrated fishing handbook, and Abigail, head of PR for a wilderness lodge. When Abigail ropes Roger into entering in her lodge's fishing tournament, she finds out he's never fished in his life. Regarded as a late-career misfire when released, Hawks's final comedy can now be seen as the last word from screwball's vanguard. 35mm. (CW)







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


